

## RECYCLABLES

The Transfer Station accepts the following recyclables. Disposal areas for these items are identified by signage.

- ALUMINUM.....cans should be clean with no labels; foil
- ANTIFREEZE..... cannot be mixed with oil.
- CARDBOARD.....corrugated only; clean & dry; broken down & flattened
- GLASS.....clean with no labels; clear, green or brown in color; no porcelain
- MAGAZINES.....any bound document (stapled or glued) excluding hardcover books
- NEWSPAPER.....clean & dry; may include newspaper inserts (glossy & colored flyers)
- OFFICE PAPER.....envelopes (no window or manilla); computer/laser paper; photocopy paper (any color); ncr paper (carbonless)
- PLASTICS.....containers types are: milk, laundry soap, dishsoap, food; containers should be clean
- TIN.....cans should be clean with no labels
- UNIVERSAL WASTE.... fluorescent lights; mercury switches; rechargeable batteries; computers; monitors; printers; keyboards; televisions; stereos
- WASTE OIL.....motor oil; transmission fluid; power steering fluid; peanut oil)

## MISCELLANEOUS WASTE

The Transfer Station accepts the following miscellaneous waste. Disposal areas for these items are identified by signage.

- BRUSH..... clean; must be 2" or less in diameter; cannot contain wire, nails, etc.; limit of 1 pickup or small utility trailer per day
- IRON / METAL..... all types of iron or metal; must be a size that can easily be disposed into the bin
- O.B.W.....oversized bulky waste such as furniture; mattresses/box springs; carpeting; oversized plastics; floor tiles; linoleum; insulation; windows; ceiling tile
- SHEETROCK..... accepted with paint, wallpaper, nails, screws
- SHINGLES.....roofing shingles; accepted with tar paper; backing; nails; not accepted with wood or metal flashing
- TIRES.....rims must be removed; limit of 6 tires per year per household
- WHITE GOODS..... stoves; refrigerators/freezers (doors must be removed); dish washers; trash compactors; washers/dryers; air conditioners; microwave ovens. If you suspect an item to contain freon, please tell one of the Attendants so they may instruct you for proper placement on the site.
- WOOD.....accepted with paint, stain, varnish, lacquer, nails, screws; may be pressure treated

## UNACCEPTABLE WASTE

The Transfer Station does not accept the following waste types. If you are in possession of any of the following and need to dispose it, please contact the Buckfield Town Office (336-2521) for a possible a disposal site.

- ANIMAL CARCASSES
- STUMPS
- LIQUID OR VISCOUS WASTE
- VEHICLE BODIES
- CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS (in excess of one pickup truck or utility trailer load per day)
- HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCE (such as but not limited to paint/stain/lacquer containers unless adequately clean and accepted by the Attendant)
- HAZARDOUS WASTE (flammable, toxic, corrosive, reactive by themselves or in combination with other waste)
- MEDICAL ITEMS (such as but not limited to prescriptive drugs, syringes, blood stained material)

## HOUSEHOLD WASTE

Any item not classified as a recyclable or miscellaneous waste is considered to be household waste and is to be disposed of in the compactor. If you question as to whether or not an item is household waste, please inquire with one of the Attendants.

## SWAP SHOP

The Swap Shop, operated by volunteers, provides our neighbors with useful & needed items and in turn eliminates tons of material from the waste stream. The Swap Shop accepts items that are clean and in usable condition and are available to Buckfield & Sumner residents free of charge. However, donations (which help pay for supplies & maintenance), are graciously accepted. If you have an item to donate that is too large to bring to the Swap Shop, feel free to post information regarding it on the bulletin board located on the Shop's exterior wall. If the Shop is closed and you have items you would like to donate, please place the item(s) in the identified storage shed. Items accepted are: Clothing; Books; DVDs; Dishes; Glassware; Toys; Appliances; Tools; Pictures; Small Furniture; Electronics.
